PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT...

The playground equipment will be out of bounds during snowy, slippery winter weather (including before, during and after school). Winter conditions can make the equipment slippery and unsafe. Let's keep Pine Grove a safe place for our children!



DRESSING FOR PLAY/ SCHOOL...



Please make sure that your child comes to school dressed for the weather. The children go outside for twenty minutes during both of our fitness breaks unless we are advised by the Niagara Regional Public Health Department of an extreme cold weather alert. As well, please make sure that your child has a pair of indoor running shoes for physical education class. Due to health and safety regulations, children without running shoes will not be allowed to participate in gym classes. Please label your children's clothing/shoe items.

KISS AND RIDE...



Our Kiss and Ride area can become quite congested with cars, especially during the winter with snow. When we have a snowfall, we unfortunately lose valuable parking spaces at Pine Grove School. If you are picking up your child in the Kiss and Ride area, please keep driving through until your child comes out of the building. Many parents are parking and waiting in this area. The designated area is a quick drop off and pick up area only. Please do not hold up traffic by stopping for your child outside the designated area. This is not safe for your child and the other children in the building. If you prefer not to use the Kiss and

Ride area, then please find a parking spot and meet your child at his/her exit doors. We are trying to keep all Pine Grove School members safe.

ENTRY/DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Parents are reminded that students should not arrive at school for the day before 8:25 a.m. as there is no yard supervision available until that time. Students are not allowed in the school in the morning before the entry bell unless there is inclement weather and the yard duty teacher has made that decision. Students are then to enter through their regular entry/exit doors and proceed directly to their classrooms.

We are asking parents as well, to wait outside your child's dismissal doors at the end of the day. Primary students are dismissed out of the northeast doors; junior students from the centre doors and intermediate students from the northwest doors at the back of the school. Kindergarten students are dismissed from the doors on their side of the building. In the primary grades, we are trying to encourage independence in dressing and organizing personal belongings and the hallways outside of all the classrooms can become quite congested during bell times. Students are asked to use their assigned dismissal doors in order for us to be able to effectively monitor the front doors of the school.

If you would like to speak with your child's teacher, please write a note in your child's agenda to arrange a time convenient for both yourself and the teacher. If your child needs to leave early for an appointment, please write a note in your child's agenda to advise the teacher then come to the office; we will call your child from class and ensure they are properly signed out of the building. Thank you for your continued co-operation.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSING...



Another reminder about making sure you have plans in place if the school should be closed for the day or close early due to inclement weather.

DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY



While we love dogs, it is also the policy of the DSBN that pets are not to be accompanying families on the school property when they drop off / pick up their children. Unless the dogs are kept in the cars, please refrain from bringing your dogs to the school.

SNOW SAFETY...

At Pine Grove School, students are aware that snow must be enjoyed in a safe manner. Snowballs and/or ice may not be thrown at any time. Children may not slide on the ice. All snow forts and snow people are community structures and must be inclusive. Students are also aware that what we build at Pine Grove; we don't destroy. Snow forts and structures must be respected.



The children are not allowed to throw snow on school property. Snow throwing jeopardizes the safety of other students and announcements will be made often throughout the season about snowball throwing. We take this rule very seriously and every student has been made aware of it. Any snow throwing will be regarded as deliberate defiance. Consequences for the first offence will be a loss of recess privileges and a note or phone call home. Repeat occurrences will result in a school suspension. Tough measures are warranted when the safety of all school members is at stake.

INFORMATION ABOUT COLD WEATHER ALERTS AT DSBN...

Winter is a time of wonder for many children; many enjoy the crisp air, the freshly fallen snow and participating in a whole host of exciting winter sports and activities.

Although we feel it is important for students to spend some time outside each day exercising and socializing with their peers, there are times when bitterly cold temperatures and other inclement weather conditions require that we keep children inside.

Because Niagara is such a large geographical area, and weather conditions may vary from one municipality to the next, the decision whether or not to hold recess outdoors is made by the individual school principal.

The health and well-being of our students is a top priority at the District School Board of Niagara, and if it is determined that the weather conditions pose a risk to their safety, students will be kept indoors. Extreme cold weather alerts issued by the Niagara Region are often good indicators that students will stay inside.

Even when temperatures are not low enough to necessitate an indoor recess, it still may be quite cold outside. Here are a few tips to help ensure that your child stays warm during the cold winter months.

- Send children to school with plenty of layers, such as long underwear, sweatshirts, sweaters and pullovers. Layering their clothing will allow them to add or remove items depending on the weather.
- Students should have a warm winter coat that repels the snow, sleet and rain, while blocking the wind.
- Warm socks and boots are a must to keep their feet warm and dry in the snow.
- Hats are one of the most important parts of dressing warmly in the winter. A thick winter hat will keep students from losing too much of that essential body heat.
- Put on a good pair of gloves or mittens that are water-resistant as well. Gloves will keep kids' hands toasty warm and protect their skin from becoming damaged by the wind and chill.
