


RESPONSIBILITY IS OUR CHARACTER EDUCATION TRAIT FOR OCTOBER


Our October Student Recognition Assembly will be held on October 28th in the gym at 9 a.m. All parents are always welcome to attend any of our assemblies.

Litterless Snack and Lunch Day: Thursday, October 6th, 2016



PIZZA LUNCHES



Again this year, we will be offering the opportunity for parents to order pizza lunches for their child. To support our school community and neighbourhood, our pizza provider again this year will be Pete's Pizza which is located on Lakeshore Road in the North End Plaza.

The first pizza day will be Friday, November 4th. No order forms will be sent home this year. **ONLY SCHOOL CASH ONLINE ORDERS WILL BE ACCEPTED**. Orders will be done by month and will be posted on School Cash Online from the first week of the prior month until the last Wednesday of the prior month.

Pizza days are a school fundraising initiative and monies raised from these lunches help subsidize our class trips, transportation costs, and to purchase learning resources for your child's classroom. Please mark these dates on your calendar and remind your child so they know whether or not to expect a pizza lunch.



THE LUNCH LADY



Our School Council is pleased to again be offering hot lunches through *"The Lunch Lady"*. Order forms for October were sent home mid September. Orders received past the due date will be accepted for the following week's lunch. Please mark these dates on your calendar and remind your child so they know whether or not to expect a Lunch Lady lunch.

Two of our reasons for offering The Lunch Lady program are the wide variety of healthy lunch options they offer, and the ease online ordering or cancellations. By using their online service, you can order at any time and are guaranteed your child's order, as well as being able to cancel "the day of" if your child is off ill or has to be absent for any reason. We have experienced issues in the past with lunch orders being misplaced or not handed in and children therefore, not receiving a lunch. The ease of online ordering has eliminated this issue. A FEW REMINDERS FROM THE OFFICE

We ask that parents make sure their children are organized with all the things they need to take to school for the day before children leave the house in the morning. However, we do understand some mornings can be more hectic than others. Please help keep our children and staff safe by reporting to the office once you enter the building. All visitors must be buzzed in and are then asked to stop at the office to let us know how we can help you. We will gladly deliver forgotten homework, lunches, running shoes, etc. during our fitness/nutrition breaks however, we will not interrupt classes to do so. Please do not deliver items to your child's locker.



As well, we must know the whereabouts of each and every student every day at Pine Grove. If your child is going to be absent, a quick phone call informing us would be greatly appreciated. Our answering machine is on 24/7.

Finally, we do send lots of order forms, letters, etc. home that must be completed and returned to the school, sometimes with payment. We would appreciate it if you would have your child give this paperwork and money to their teacher rather than handing it in at the office. Homeroom teachers do track the return of necessary forms, payments, etc. Thank you for your co-operation.

PARKING LOT/KISS AND RIDE

Our Kiss and Ride area and parking lot gets very congested and busy at the beginning and end of each day. If you are picking up your child after school, we suggest that you arrive by 2:55 p.m. to find a parking spot or make arrangements to pick up your child in the drive through Kiss and Ride area. The area by the orange pylons is strictly a drop off area prior to 8:40 a.m., a pick up area at 3:00 p.m. and a fire route during the school day. It is very important for the safety of our students, staff and parents that you do not double park and leave your car to go and pick up your child. Also, a reminder to parents to not park in the bus loading zone in front of the school.

2016-2017 ELEMENTARY PROGRESS REPORT

On November 6th, your child will bring home their Elementary Progress Report. The format was created after years of consultation with parents, teachers, principals, and students across the province. Although it looks much like the Report Card, this report has a very different intent. The purpose of the Progress



Report is to share early and specific feedback on your child's development of work habits and learning skills as well as his/her progress towards achieving the curriculum standards by the end of the school year.

Traditionally, when reporting to parents about their child's progress, teachers have prepared by *looking back* over the work done. The teacher evaluated your child's progress from the beginning of the school term to the current point in time, and reported on the highlights of achievement as they compare to overall curricular expectations. Teachers continue to report on Provincial Term One and Term Two Report Cards in this manner.



Reporting on the Progress Report is about *looking forward*. The purpose is to set the course for the learning journey ahead. Based on the evidence teachers see, as well as what teachers know about learning at this grade level, the report communicates the path your child is on towards achieving the grade level expectations by the end of the year. For students who are on a modified Individual Education Program, the

teacher uses those modified goals when determining whether a child is progressing well, progressing very well, or progressing with difficulty.

All subjects that are part of your child's program in the first weeks of school will be assessed according to the following indicators:

Progressing Very Well: In the first weeks of school, evidence shows that the student is demonstrating consistent progress and is on track to meet and/or surpass the provincial standard set for the end of the year.

Progressing Well: In the first weeks of school, evidence shows that the student is demonstrating consistent progress and is on track to meet the provincial standard set for the end of the year.

Progressing With Difficulty: In the first weeks of school, evidence shows that the student is experiencing difficulty towards meeting the provincial standard set for the end of the year. For subjects in which your child is Progressing With Difficulty, the teacher will discuss specific next steps plans needed for success. We look forward to partnering with you and your child for a year of great learning and growth.

HALLOWE'EN ACTIVITIES

Please note that we have not scheduled a pizza lunch for the Friday of Halloween due to the number of students who go home during the lunch break to get ready for the afternoon festivities. Please make sure your child has a lunch on this day if they are staying at school.

Please help us keep Pine Grove a heart healthy school by keeping Hallowe'en treats and candies at home. Remember to send in healthy nutritional foods to school with your child everyday for our nutrition breaks.



HALLOWEEN

Some pointers to keep the trick or treaters safe from the Niagara Regional Public Health:

- Children under nine years of age should go out with an adult or responsible older child.
- Be sure your child stops at all curbs, looks left, right and left again to check for traffic. Remind children to cross at crosswalks, street corners or intersections. It is important they walk on the sidewalk, or walk facing the traffic if there is no sidewalk.
- Bright coloured costumes make your child easier to see. You can use reflective tape on a costume to make your child more visible. Face paint instead of a mask helps them to see well. Have your child carry a flashlight.
- When they get home, check all of their treats carefully. Throw out any treats that aren't wrapped, if the wrapping is torn or loose, or if the wrapper has a hole. Remember that small treats can cause your child to choke.
- You might want to offer an alternative to sugar based treats. Stickers or multi-coloured pencils can be a nice surprise in place of, or in addition to, traditional treats.





CHANGE IN CROSSING GUARD TIMES

We have been advised by the City of St. Catharines that crossing guard hours in the Pine Grove School area have been changed effective September 30th.

The guard at Lake Street/Lakeshore Road will be on duty 8:00 - 8:40 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. - 3:40 p.m. There will be NO crossing guard in attendance over the lunch hour.



FLU SEASON IS HERE!

Washing your hands prevents the spread of germs and reduces your risk of getting sick. Wash your hands after:

- coughing or sneezing
- blowing your nose
- using the washroom
- playing with pets
- playing outdoors
- and before preparing meals and eating

Use warm water and soap, lather and scrub for at least 15 seconds. Have children sing the ABC song, so they scrub for long enough. Alcohol-based hand sanitizers are safe for children and can be used when you don't see any dirt. For more information, talk to your school nurse.
